Organic Chemistry, The general organic text you will need is J. Clayden, N. Greeves and S. Warren, 'Organic Chemistry' (Oxford University Press, 2012). The first edition (2001) is also OK. M. Hornby and J. Peach 'Foundations of Organic Chemistry', (Oxford University Press, 1993). Please revise your understanding of Chapter 1 before coming up.

Inorganic Chemistry, M. Weller, T. Overton, J. Rourke and F. Armstrong, <u>'Inorganic Chemistry'</u> (Oxford University Press, 6th Edition, 2014). https://www.amazon.co.uk/Inorganic-Chemistry-Mark-Weller/dp/019964182X
